Amends [872 IAC 1-1-6.6](#) concerning nonaccredited institutions. Amends [872 IAC 1-1-8](#) concerning experience requirements. Amends [872 IAC 1-1-8.4](#) concerning advanced degrees. Amends [872 IAC 1-1-9](#) concerning examination requirements. Adds [872 IAC 1-1-9.6](#) concerning the education required to sit for the CPA examination.
