OVERVIEW: Adds provisions pursuant to P.L.255-2001, SECTION 11, regarding attendant care services for individuals in need of self-directed in-home care, concerning requirements for registration as a personal services attendant, method of payment to a personal services attendant, record keeping requirements for a personal services attendant, the handling and investigation of complaints concerning the neglect, abuse, mistreatment, or misappropriation of property of an individual in need of self-directed in-home care by a personal services attendant, and corresponding notice, administrative hearing, and appeal procedures.
