OVERVIEW: Public Law 195-2001 (HEA 1401) contains several provisions that affect rules previously promulgated by the Indiana department of administration (department). The department also intends to revise, edit, delete, add, or otherwise amend the existing rules, as it may deem desirable in order to make them compliant with the provisions of Public Law 195-2001. Although the department is still in the process of identifying all rules that may be affected by Public Law 195-2001, it has determine that amendments will be required to 25 IAC 1.1 (regarding state procurement), and 25 IAC 2 (regarding public works projects).
